Interview with Kayla

Kayla Lamouche was 16 years old and in Grade 10 when she had her son Nathaniel. She connected with Terra when Nathaniel was six months old to continue her high school education at Braemar School. Kayla had a daughter, Teanna after her son. Kayla graduated from Braemar in 2009 and is now 21 years old. She lives with the father of her children who are five and two years old. In January, Kayla will study Chemical Engineering Technology at NAIT. Here are some thoughts from Kayla on her experience as a teen mom who received support from Terra.

How did Terra help you?

Terra provided great emotional support for me. My outreach worker, Gail was incredible. She helped me find an apartment and provided bus tickets. Both my children were in the Terra Childcare Centre, on-site at Braemar School. Nathaniel was in the Centre at six months old and Teanna at three weeks old. It was so convenient for me as I breastfed. I didn't feel as guilty leaving them and the Childcare staff were incredible. The Clothes Closet at Braemar also helped me out a lot as I could pick out really nice donated clothes at no cost for my kids. When Nathaniel was a bit older, Terra gave us tickets to Eskimos and Oil Kings games. My son and I loved going to the games!

When I was in grade 12 at Braemar, I think I was a good role model for the younger students. I tried hard to set a good example and tell them to work hard at their education for a positive future for themselves and their children.

How are teen parents perceived in the community?

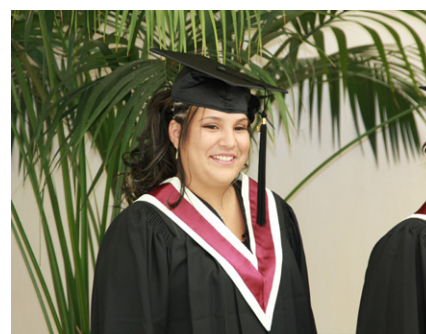
Teen parents are judged and many people have a negative opinion of us. Especially when I was younger, I heard the whispers about "kids having kids". I learned to ignore what people say as I know I'm doing the best I can for me and my family.

How can the community support Terra and teen parents?

I want to spread the word that teen parents can be good parents. They have potential to be successful in their careers when they are older and have healthy relationships with their children as they were young when they had them. The community can support Terra with donations.

What are your ambitions?

I want to work for the government as a Chemical Engineering Technologist after I graduate from NAIT.

2011 Marks 40 Years of Community Service

With 2011 quickly approaching, we have been reminiscing a great deal over the last few months about the history of Terra. Hardly a day passes at Terra without a phone call, chance meeting or email from an alumni, former staff or volunteer. Often their stories and encounters leave me tingling in awe and amazement. Their spirit and passion for Terra is still so much alive!

During the summer our sleuth student spent many hours researching individuals to connect with who have a past with Terra in any shape or form. Her efforts paid off and many stories were shared and written to assist us as we embark on tracing and documenting the history of Terra.

At our recent September staff meeting we were privileged to have Kay Feehan, a Terra historical figure join us to share her Terra experience from over 40 years ago. Kay was discovered during the research efforts. She was the first Social Worker for the few teen moms who originally joined Terra, (two years before Terra was incorporated). She was deeply impacted by her work and relationships with these young people. Their strong, determined spirits are what she recalled so vividly. Kay spoke passionately about the mission of Terra 40 years ago... high school completion and the importance of raising self confidence. Here we are 40 years later with

the same vision for our teen parents!!

Kay reaffirms for us the mission of Terra has been upheld for 40 years. Meeting with hundreds of alumni over the last few years reaffirms the value and importance of Terra. Since 1971, thousands of teen parents and their children have benefited from the support and encouragement offered to them through Terra. The community has also benefited. We see alumni as successful community members in every direction; board members Cam Miles and Barb Hoff Morin, Amanda Babichuk, owner of d'Lish, five alumni employed at Terra as outreach staff and hundreds more. You will hear more about some of them this year as we profile 40 Years - 40 Stories of Terra.

There is much to celebrate in recognizing 40 years. Plans are on the drawing table for a number of activities. Endowment Fund

Terra started to explore ways to secure a sustainable future for the agency a few years ago. A new endowment fund was created and interested donors were encouraged to designate their giving or planned giving to this fund. In an endowment fund, the capital invested (or donated) remains untouched in perpetuity. Only the interest generated from the fund is used to fulfill the objective of the fund.

For example, in 1995 the Poole family endowed \$100,000 in a fund dedicated to the healthy nutrition of teen families. Today the fund still remains at around \$100,000 and has generated more than \$100,000 in interest.

David King from the Alberta Association of School Boards retired in June. In lieu of gifts, this Association donated \$2,750.00 to the Terra endowment fund at the Edmonton Community Foundation. David King is so supportive of the work Terra does with the teen moms at Braemar School and requested these funds be directed to our endowment fund for scholarships.
